

## A Summary of 2007 CSA Shares

This chart describes which crops our members received this year, how often they received them and in what amounts. Very often, we offered choices of several crops. For example, when we offered 2 pounds total of squash, cucumbers and okra combined, then 2 pounds is listed here as the amount available for all three crops that week. A member could have taken an average of a pound and a half of okra for the ten weeks it was offered, but very few people did. Most people chose to take other items, such as squash and cucumbers instead. Therefore, this chart indicates how much each member could have taken of the crops they favored, but not necessarily what they did take when there were other choices available.
